

DIRECTIONS FROM DUBAI TO HATTA

From Dubai, take the Sharjah-Kalba Road [E102] for approximately 70 kilometres towards the Hatta Exit. Keep left then go straight ahead for 24 kilometres. At the roundabout, take the third exit onto the Dubai-Hatta Road [E44] and head for seven kilometres towards the Hatta Fort roundabout. Take the second exit and stay on the Dubai-Hatta Road [E44] for two kilometres. Turn right and Hatta Wadi Hub will be on your left.

HATTA SIGN

Measuring 19.28m tall, the Hatta sign is an awe-inspiring landmark that lights up once nighttime arrives. The structure is located on the Hajar Mountains – hikers are welcome to trek up, take memorable photos and survey the area's beautiful landscape from up high. To reach the sign, start at Hatta Wadi Hub and follow the mountain trail for approximately seven kilometres.

You can also buy traditional wares including everything from jewellery to pottery.



HATTA DAM

The best way to soak up the natural beauty of this serene spot is directly from the water. Rent kayaks, canoes, paddleboards and more and then make your way across the smooth waters – taking in the rugged mountains and abundant greenery on the way. Another striking feature here is the large mural commemorating the UAE's founding fathers, the late Sheikh Zayed bin Sultan Al Nahyan and Sheikh Rashid bin Saeed Al Maktoum.



Located around 130 kilometres south-east of central Dubai, the mountain town of Hatta was once known for its historic fort and small desert farms, but now attracts a wide range of adventure enthusiasts too. Pack your camping gear for a trek through the unforgettable dreamlike landscapes and take it all in, from many thrill-adventure activities at Wadi Hub at Hatta Resorts to honey harvesting at the Hatta Honeybee Garden and Discovery Center.

English is widely spoken in Dubai, but it's polite to try a few words in Arabic, the official language of the UAE. You'll probably see *Ahlan wa sahlan fi Dubai* (Welcome to Dubai) when you first arrive, but why not try these ten common phrases:

MARHABA	Hello
SABAH ALKHAYR	Good morning
AS-SALAAM ALAIKUM	Peace be upon you A common greeting in the Arab and Muslim world
SHUKRAN	Thank you
AASIF	Sorry
MIN FADLAK	Please
BI KAM?	How much?
NA'AM / LA	Yes / No
MA HADHA?	What is this?
MAASALAAMAH	Goodbye



HATTA HONEYBEE GARDEN & DISCOVERY CENTER

Discover the amazing world of honeybees at this 16,000sqm sanctuary, which highlights the importance of these busy insects to our environment. HATTA WATCHTOWER

Explore the central Hatta Fort, built in 1896, and one of the most significant architectural monuments in the UAE. The detailed structure served as a residence and defence facility, with a large internal courtyard and an 11m-high watchtower. The building, which was restored in 1995, is made of mountain stones and mud bricks, while the ceiling is constructed using palm fronds, trunks and mud.

The UAE currency is the dirham (AED/Dhs). All major international banks and ATMs are widely available.

Dubai's arid subtropical climate sees clear blue skies for most of the year. Average temperatures are around 41°C in summer and 23°C in winter.

Arabic is the official language. English is widely spoken.

- Health**
Dubai Health Authority (DHA) regulates all medical services. The DHA runs the Rashid, Latifa and Dubai Hospitals, where all emergency services are free. Private hospital fees vary.
- Telecommunications**
The country code is +971 and the area code is 04. Network services are provided by Etisalat, du and Virgin Mobile.
- Utilities**
Electricity: UK-style three-pin sockets are widely used.
Water: Bottled mineral water is served in hotels and restaurants, and is also available in supermarkets.
